

In early 2024, after two decades in Asia, **Elisabeth de Brabant** introduced her newest private art viewing space and cultural platform, EdB Contemporary, located on the Fondamenta Zattere in Venice.

This newly restored space highlights artists whose social consciousness. EdB Contemporary aims to promote humanitarian awareness through collaborations with the global organization Women without Borders, while also contributing to the local art community in Venice.

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Géraldine Cario is a multidisciplinary artist based in Paris, France. Cario's use of diverse materials aims to spark existential reflection and dialogue. Through her seemingly abstract works, Cario offers a unique perspective on collective memory at an emotional level. Her solo exhibitions include "Paris-Odessa" at the Institut Français & Goethe Institut, Bucharest, Romania, in January-February 2024, and at Le Bastion, Timișoara, Romania, as part of "Timișoara, European Capital of Culture," in 2023; "Les hasards nécessaires" at the Institut Français, Tel Aviv, Israel, June-July 2023.

The solo exhibition by **Géraldine Cario**, titled "Fractured Continuum," will remain on view until August 11, 2024. It brings together diverse works from the artist's expansive career, showcasing her mastery across various media: photography, mixed media, sculpture, performative sound installations, and video.

The topics it addresses include the phenomena of endurance and the drive to leave a lasting legacy that generations instilled in us, the fluidity of memory, and the relativity of knowledge. Broken bridges, restored glass objects, boiled ink, safety blankets, and intact targets become the main conduits that help the artist speak about those subjects on a universal level. The exhibition is designed as a three-chapter pathway that guides you to the ultimate installation, which, through sound and visual means, embodies ideas introduced in the previous artworks.

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controversial phenomena of Venice's existence The addressed in several artworks throughout the show. A blackout room recreates a 3-dimensional experience of witnessing a storm on the island. 'Histoire en Morceaux' features pieces of a broken glass vase sinking in the solid black mass. It represents the singular, fragile, and endlessly profound context of the city, where the labyrinth of bridges exists both as a means to join the man-made islands and to spread and disorient those who are not familiar with the city's complex dynamics. Several old postcards with traditional images of Venetian bridges glow in the dark space, illuminated by colorful lightning, continuing the series that represent bridges in Japan. The artist associates both locations with the miracle of the law of life, which forces people to constantly repair broken parts of their paths and lives.



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



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
